

Using Sibelius Teaching Tools with Sibelius 2

Sibelius 2 has many new features not in previous versions of the program. If you use Sibelius 2, the new features affect how you do a few things in Sibelius Teaching Tools; the changes are listed below.

If you use Sibelius 1.4 or earlier you are not affected, and you can ignore this sheet.

Student Skills Guide

The toolbar at the top of the screen looks slightly different, and there are no longer names below the toolbar buttons; the names now appear when you hover the mouse over a button (on Windows), and are also shown on the Sibelius mouse pad.

When creating notes and other objects with the mouse, you should have nothing selected beforehand (otherwise the new object will appear next to the selected object). So advise your students to hit `ESC` (to deselect) before creating objects.

Skills

- 7–11, 21–23, 25 Hit `ESC` before you start to ensure nothing is selected
- 9, 14, 29, 32 These keyboard shortcuts have changed – see menus for new ones
- 15 Keypad layouts have change slightly
- 30 Voices are now chosen in the `General` panel of the `Properties` window
- 33 Sounds dialog has been replaced by the Mixer – see User Guide p. 299 onwards

Page

- 33–37 `Click When Playing` no longer has a shortcut – access this option by clicking `Click...` on the Mixer
- 68–69 `N` no longer adds a third; type `3` instead
- 110–111 `Filter` is now in the `Edit` menu
- 199 The `House Style` dialog is now the `House Style>Engraving Rules` dialog

The following exercises are much easier if you use these new features in Sibelius 2:

- C3 Further arranging Use the `Arrange` feature
- T2 Preparing a piano piece See `Splitting voices` on p. 465 of the User Guide instead
- T3 Making a worksheet Check to see whether one of the `Worksheet` manuscript papers will suit your requirements before you create your own
